Introduction

- Have you gone through a great difficulty in your life that has helped change you? Can you share?

We live in a wicked world and terrible things happen, but as a believer God has promised that he will work all things together for good. In Romans 8:28-29 we are told that through these things we will be changed to become more like Jesus.
