1. Jesus: the One over God's House

Introduction

The Book of Hebrews is about Jesus! Although we are not certain who wrote this letter, we know that it was one of the early Church leaders, who was writing to believers in Rome. Many of these believers were becoming legalistic, so the author shows that we have freedom in Christ and that the entire Old Testament pointed towards his coming and what he would do for us. As we study this book we will learn much about the Christian life, but also gain a deeper insight into the Old Testament.

1. Jesus: Who is He? Hebrews 1:1-14

- ❖ How do verses 1-3 help us to answer the question above? What can we learn about Jesus from this?
- ❖ To prove that Jesus is superior to all others, including the angels, the author quotes seven Old Testament scriptures. What do these scriptures show us about Jesus? V5-13
- ❖ Who is the source of all these statements about Jesus? V5, 6, 7, 8, 10, 13
- ❖ Of all the things written about Jesus in these verses, which one encourages you the most? Why?
- ❖ What do these verses tell us about angels? V4, 6, 7, 13, 14. Why do you think the author compares Jesus to the angels? What important truth does this show us?

2. What must we do? Hebrews 2:1-4

The writer of this book shares many wonderful truths about Jesus, however following this he goes on to tell us the importance of holding onto those truths and not falling away. He does this again and again throughout the book. In chapter one he speaks about who Jesus is and then tells us what we must do in the light of this knowledge.

- ❖ What warning are we given in Hebrews 2:1, 3?
- ❖ What are the results of ignoring this warning in verses 2 and 3?
- ❖ Are there any things in your life that might cause you to drift away? How can these truths we have learnt help us not to drift? Discuss.
