10. Living as God' Children

Introduction

Chapter 8 of Romans begins with the words, "There is now no condemnation to those who are in Christ Jesus." Isn't that encouraging? We may have failed, but we can return to the Lord, knowing that we are not condemned, but free to live in the power of the Spirit. Let's turn back to Romans 8 to see how the Holy Spirit helps us.

Scripture Reading: Romans 8:17-27

1. Suffering of Creation v17-27

- What will we share in now according to Romans 8:17-18? What do we have to look forward to in the future?
- How has man's sin affected the world in the past, and how is affecting the world right now? Romans 8:20, Genesis 3:17-19
- What is God's purpose for the earth according to verse 21? What do you think this means?

2. Suffering of Children of God v23-27

The Apostle Paul has shown that man's sin has affected all of creation. Now he goes on to say that we all face suffering, but in the midst of this there is hope and help.

- The word 'groan' is used 3 times in these verses. What things are described as 'groaning'? v22, 23, 26
- What is the hope we have as we go through suffering? What does this mean? Romans 8:23
- Why do we need the help of the Holy Spirit and how does he help us according to verses 26 and 27?
- Share a time when you have experienced the help of the Holy Spirit to pray in a way that these verses describe.

Conclusion

We live in a world affected by sin and at times we struggle with our sinful nature. However we have a blessed hope that one day we will be freed from this body and receive a new one.
