12. <u>A Call to Live by Faith (1)</u>



Introduction

Faith! This is a word we often use, but do we know what it really means? In our study of the Book of Hebrews we have come to chapter 11, often known as the 'faith chapter' of the Bible. In the earlier chapters we have been looking at Jesus, who is the High Priest over God's House. We are God's House, together with all those who have put their trust in Jesus. Since he is our High Priest we are urged to draw near with full assurance of faith. Now in chapter 11 it goes on and gives examples of those who have had faith and inherited the promises.

- Why do we sometimes find it difficult to trust God? What can we do to overcome these difficulties?
- How does God regard our faith? V2-4, 5-6, 16
- Faith begins with hearing God speak to us, but then it must be followed by obedience to that word.
 What actions followed the faith of the following men: Abel in v4, Noah in v7, Abraham in v8 and v17?
