MEANING OF PETER'S CONFESSION Matthew 16:16-17

The Christ - Peter believed Jesus was the Messiah, the 'Anointed One', who had been promised long ago by the Old Testament prophets.

Son of God - He also believed Jesus was divine, that He was God in flesh.

This was an amazing answer. Jesus showed him that he knew this because 'it has been revealed to him by God.' See v17. Let's be thankful that God has revealed this to us too. We are blessed, just like Peter! When we share with others about Jesus we need to pray, as we cannot convince anyone about who Jesus is. However the Holy Spirit can.

POWER OF PETER'S CONFESSION Matthew 16:18-19

Jesus responded to Peter's confession with some wonderful promises about the Kingdom of Heaven.

How can we be more effective in using the keys of the Kingdom?

There was tremendous power in Peter's confession. It says in Romans 10:9, "If you confess with your mouth Jesus is Lord, and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved." At this time Jesus had not yet been crucified, but Peter made the confession that Jesus was Lord. Anyone who makes this confession from his heart enters the Kingdom of Heaven.
