A suggested summary

- Gold speaks of our material possessions and finances, and we can offer these to the Lord.
- Frankincense speaks of worship and prayer in the Bible, and we are to bring these to Him.
- Myrrh speaks of sacrifice and death, and we are to die to our selfish desires and offer our bodies as a living sacrifice to Him.
- The wise men brought very costly gifts to Jesus – the best they had. Let us bring our best to Him in everything!
