Introduction

- + We are not saved 'by works' but 'to do good works'. What is the difference?
- What do you think those 'good works' are that God has prepared for us to do? Look at the following verses to give you some insight into what 'good works' are. John 4:34, John 17:4, John 15:5, Acts 9:36, Acts 10:38
- Is there anything we need to change in our lives or our thinking so that we fulfill those 'good works' that God has prepared for us?

He has already planned and prepared a new life for us, using the gifts and abilities He has given us, so that our lives will be fulfilled and He will be glorified.
