## 30. The Judgment



### Revelation 20

#### Introduction

In our previous study from the Book of Revelation we learnt about the thousand year reign of Christ on the earth – often called ‘The Millennium’. Immediately following this is an awesome and fearful event for those who do not know Jesus – it is called the ‘Day of Judgment.’ We will look into the Word of God to see what it teaches us about God’s judgment.

**Scripture Reading:** Revelation 20:11-15



John sees a great white throne and someone sitting on it. Who is this one? V11  
Also compare with Revelation 4:3, 5: 6-7; John 8:16, 5:22, 30; Acts 10:42



On what basis are the dead judged according to v12-13. Does this include only those who don’t believe or everyone? Also see Romans 2:6-8; 2 Corinthians 5:10; 1 Peter 1:17.

All men are judged according to their works however they will be separated into two groups, with two different destinations.



What determines the ultimate destiny of every person according to v15 and Revelation 21:27?

All those whose names are found recorded in the Lamb’s Book of Life will be with the Lord for eternity. As we have seen they too will be judged for their works, and will have to give an account for the way they have lived their life for the Lord. See Romans 14:12. This judgment takes place at the second coming of Jesus, and is called the ‘judgment seat of Christ’. The word used in the Greek for ‘judgment seat’ is the word that is used to describe the judge’s bench at sports events, where rewards were given to those who do well.



Discuss the principles and standards by which God will judge and reward each of his children. Luke 12:47-48; Matthew 12:36-37; 1 Corinthians 3:11-15; 2 Corinthians 5:10



Why is it important every Christian understands the judgments of God? What affect does this knowledge have on you personally?

#### Conclusion

It is somewhat sobering to realize that we must stand before the Lord! This is why the Apostle Paul said in 2 Corinthians 5:9, “So **we make it out goal to please Him**, whether we are at home in the body or away from it. This is what motivated Paul to preach the gospel and to live a life that pleased the Lord. We are truly blessed to have come to know Jesus as our Lord and Savior, but let us be wise how we live, knowing that one day soon we will have to give an account to Him.
