THE LIFE OF GIDEON

6. Gideon's Army



Introduction

Gideon had gathered his army, 32,000 men from the northern tribes of Israel. The Lord had assured him of victory, and so now he was ready to move into battle. Then God tells him that his army is too large! That seems incredible as the enemy army is enormous in comparison. In fact the Bible describes it being like a swarm of locusts. In this study we will see how God prepared those He wanted to use.

Scripture Reading: Judges 7:1-8

Who were the ones that God sent back? v3

It is interesting that the place where Gideon and his men were camped was called the 'Spring of Harod', which literally means 'spring of trembling'. More than two-thirds of the men went back.

Just as in Gideon's time, many may respond to God's call, but not all are willing to face the battle. God can only use those who are willing to totally trust Him. Gideon now only had 10,000 men, but God said there were still too many!

- How can we be ready to stand against the attacks of the enemy? Ephesians 6:11, 1 Peter 5:8-9 Why is self-control so important?
- Read through verses 1 to 8 again yourself and share one thing that speaks to you.

Conclusion

God chose the men who were alert and ready. Even though Gideon only had 300 men left in his army, they were men that God could use. God is still looking for men and women and young people He can use today. He uses those who fully put their trust in Him and will stand against the enemy. Are we preparing ourselves to be part of His army?
