In our last study we began to look at the principles or laws of the Kingdom. The Gospel of Matthew follows a pattern similar to the Books of the Law in the Old Testament. There are 5 books in the Law (Genesis to Deuteronomy) and the Gospel of Matthew can also be divided into 5 sections. The Law was given to the Children of Israel by Moses, and in Matthew 5-7 we read the Laws of the Kingdom that were given to God's people by someone greater than Moses – and that is the Lord Jesus Christ.
