6. The Power of the Word



Introduction

The walls and the gates of the city had been completed. Nehemiah acknowledged that this had only been possible with the help of their God. Then gatekeepers, singers and Levites were appointed, along with men to be in charge of the city. When the 7th month came the people celebrated the Feast of the Seventh Month, which was the Feast of Tabernacles.

- Each day Ezra the Scribe read from the Book of the Law. How did the people respond? See verses 3, 6, 9, 12, 14, 16
- What can God's Word do in our lives according to the following verses? Psalm 119:9, 11, John 6:63, Romans 10:17, Ephesians 5:26, 2 Timothy 3:16, 17
- God's Word changed the lives of the people in the time of Nehemiah. Why did it have such an impact? What can we learn from this? Also see Psalm 119:12-16, Matthew 5:6
- What has encouraged or challenged you from this story? Share.
