Scripture Reading: Hebrews 9:11-28

- Although some may find it difficult to speak about the blood of Jesus, it is very important in the Word of God. What is the difference between the blood of animals and the blood of Jesus? V13-14, 25-26
- ❖ What can the blood of Jesus do in our lives according to v14 and v22?
- ❖ What else can we learn about the importance of the blood from Leviticus 17:11-12 and Romans 3:25?
- In Revelation 12:11 it says, 'they overcame him by the blood of the Lamb.' How can we overcome Satan by the blood of Jesus in our daily lives? Discuss.

Consider

The forgiveness of our sin was costly for Jesus. It cost his life! Think of some examples in human relationships when forgiveness has cost someone a great deal. Why is forgiveness costly to us?

- ❖ If it is difficult to forgive, why does God command us to do so? How can knowing the truth about the blood of Jesus help us to obey?
- At the end of this chapter it speaks about the judgement and the second coming of Jesus. See v27-28. Why is it so important that we know the power of the blood of Jesus in the light of these great events that will take place?
