☒ How did Joseph's brothers feel about this? V4, 11

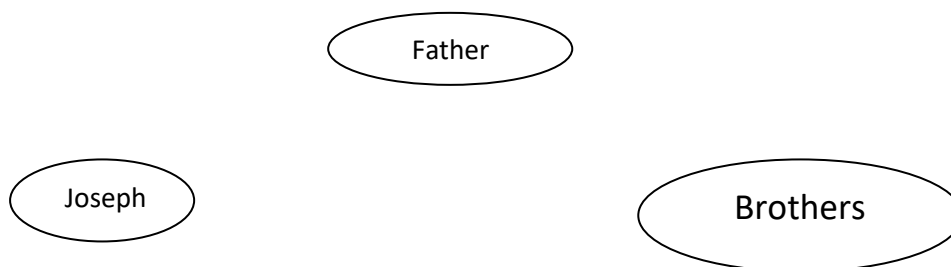
**Share**

4. Draw a dotted line for a relationship in conflict. .....



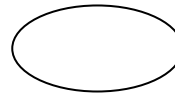
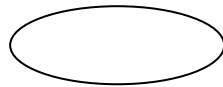
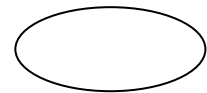
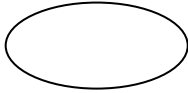
**Share**
