THE NAME JEHOVAH

4. Jehovah Shalom



The next covenantal name for God we are going to look at is 'The One who is our Peace' or 'Jehovah Shalom'. We see this name revealed in the Book of Judges in the life of Gideon.

At this time the Midianites were oppressing the Children of Israel. Gideon was threshing wheat in a winepress to hide from the Midianites, when an angel appeared to him, telling him God would use him to deliver the Israelites. Wanting to be sure this really was a messenger from God, Gideon asked for a sign. Let's read the story.

SCRIPTURE READING: Judges 6:11-24

- ☼ Why do you think Gideon asked the angel for a sign? V17 Discuss.
- ☼ What sign did the angel give? V20-21 Why would this have been significant to Gideon do you think?

At this time the people believed they would die if they saw an angel, so when Gideon realized he had encountered an Angel of the Lord, he was afraid.

- ☼ What comfort did God give Gideon and how did he respond? V23-24

As an Israelite, Gideon lived under the Old Testament covenant. Sadly because of their unfaithfulness to God the people were being oppressed by the Midianites, and they were not experiencing the blessings and promises God had given them. However when Gideon encountered the Angel of the Lord he had a revelation of the Lord as the one who gives peace. The Lord himself was his peace.

There are several ways in which we all need peace. Firstly, we need peace with God.

What provision has God made for us, so we can have peace with him? Romans 5:1, Colossians 1:19-20

When we have peace with God, we can experience the peace of God in the midst of difficult situations, just as Gideon did.

CONCLUSION

Gideon was living in a difficult time, and his people were in fear of the Midianites who stole their crops and livestock, leaving them impoverished. However, when Gideon encountered the Angel from God he had a revelation that the Lord himself was the source of his peace.

In the same way, Jesus is our peace. When we accept the sacrifice Jesus made on the cross, we have peace with God, and the assurance that his peace is available in every situation we face in life. If you are going through a difficult time, facing conflict and loss like Gideon was, God wants to give you his peace. This peace is not dependent on circumstances, but an inner peace that no one can take away. And the reason why no one can take away this peace is because JESUS HIMSELF IS OUR PEACE. (Ephesians 2:14)
