INTRODUCTION

Do you sometimes feel unworthy of receiving God's love? Perhaps you don't feel good enough, or that you have done things that disqualify you. In this study we are going to look at another name for God that reveals to us his incredible love, and once we truly understand the meaning of this name, those feelings of inadequacy will go.

We have been looking at the meaning of the name Yahweh or Jehovah, the sacred name given by God to his people, and linked to that name are 7 different titles, each one showing his covenant-keeping faithfulness to man. The name we will look at now is found in prophecies given by Jeremiah: - The Lord is our Righteousness.

SCRIPTURE READING Jeremiah 23:5-6, 33:15-16

- ☼ What did the prophet say the Messiah, the Righteous Branch, would do when he came?

God was going to restore righteousness, but this righteousness would not be a set of laws or rules, or a religious system, rather it would be in a person. That person was the Lord Jesus Christ.

- ☼ Why is our righteousness not acceptable to God? Look at the following verses: Romans 3:10, 3:20-23, Romans 10:3-4, Isaiah 64:6
- Although our righteousness is not acceptable to God, he is offering us his righteousness! How can we receive this? See the following verses: Romans 3:22, 10:4, Philippians 3:8-9
- An exchange takes place! Look at these verses and describe what Jesus has done for us, and what we become: 1 Corinthians 1:30, 2 Corinthians 5:21
- Now we have received the righteousness of Jesus, how can the Word of God help us to live out a righteous life? 2 Timothy 3:16-17, Revelation 19:8
- Share what you have learnt from this study. It may be something you have understood for the first time, or perhaps something you have been reminded of.



CONCLUSION Isn't it amazing what God has done for us? We were separated from him because of our sin, with no way to reach him. Even our so called 'righteous deeds' were like dirty rags compared to his holiness. Yet in his love for us, he came and paid the price for our sin, so we could receive his righteousness.
